<sup>1</sup> Early watches recorded times to 1/4th or 1/5th of a second. Where they were originally returned to the 1/5th, we have shown them as such. Manual timekeeping guidelines are that an athlete's time should be recorded by three timekeepers with a consensus being reached among them as to the time to be officially returned. Even the best manual timekeepers today may find themselves at odds with each other, either side of 1/10th with the need to round up to the next whole 1/10th. Consider that a hand-timed 9.91 on a modern digital watch = a returned time of 10.0, whereas 9.89 or 9.90 = a returned time of 9.9. And who knows, now, whether a single watch might have sometimes been used at a club meeting?

<sup>2</sup> For the 100 yards wind readings for races earlier than 1960 are often not known and quite possibly were not even recorded or much considered in the very earliest days. Therefore, performances known to be wind-assisted are included in the list. However, see also the 100 yards supporting list and the footnote relating to it.

<sup>3</sup> Frank L. Craft, who joined Belgrave in June 1951, aged 25, reputedly ran 9.9 at Motspur Park (in 1951 or earlier?) and 9.8 in 1952. These times are not listed among the best British performances during those years and we are unable to find any further information to back them up. During 1951 Frank did run in club races for Belgrave some half a second slower than the 9.9 which has been noted against his name by a former statistician, but he had emigrated to Queensland, Australia by December 1951. Writing home in 1952 he mentions that he had there run 9.8 and 21.8w. Colin Collis, Belgrave statistician from the 1950s and writing in December 1952 and April 1953, makes no mention of Craft, and records Denis Merrett's 10.0 performances as being the Club's Record. So, Frank was no longer a member in 1952 and as for his possible 1951 9.9 we simply record it here as a footnote.

<sup>4</sup> Alan Sexton was in the USA with an Oxford & Cambridge University/Achilles team in June 1953 and Colin Collis noted that he ran 10.0, equalling the Club Record. The exact date is not known. See also the following footnote.

<sup>5</sup> Not previously recorded in Belgrave H records, Alan Sexton, as reported in 'Athletics World', October 1953, published by the McWhirters, and the UK All-time lists 1957 by the same authors, ran 9.9n in Philadelphia on 20.06.1953. The 'n' indicates 'not a winning time'. The Philadelphia race was won in 9.7 and Alan did not place in the first 4. In this era, it was common for just the winning time to be published and it is possible that even Alan Sexton did not know his exact time and assumed it to be 10.0 – i.e. his 9.9 and 10.0 are the same performance. In correspondence with the NUTS regarding Sexton, Peter Matthews stated, "I'd accept the 9.9, as the McWhirters ... were very close to the Achilles Club and would have had access to information on the Oxford & Cambridge tour. On the same day it is believed that Alan Sexton placed =4 in a 220 yards race in 21.9. Michael Sheridan also includes Sexton's time of 9.9 in 'British Athletics 1951-1959'.

<sup>6</sup> Ron Holtum's 9.9 100 yards performance of 1954 has been clearly noted by a previous statistician, without any further detail, but no trace of it can be found in any ranking lists of the era and Colin Collis did not list it as a Club Record. Ron's 10.0 at the AAA Champs of 1955 was given an honourable mention in Athletics Weekly as, "Holtum put up his very best ever performance ..."

<sup>7</sup> Possibly the meeting was the Caledonian Games, held at the White City, London, on 21.05.1955. It would have to have been a heat as Dennis Merrett won the final in 10.0. Not shown as w/a by the McWhirters in Athletics World.

<sup>8</sup> Due to the slight doubt about Alan Sexton's 9.9 in 1953, the fact that details are not known about Ron Holtum's 9.9 in 1954, and that Ivan Mayers' 9.9 times were both wind assisted, this supporting list 1953 to 1961 is presented, showing times equalling the previous record of 10.0. In 1961 Peter Eldridge's 9.9 tied things up with a performance that fulfilled our Club Record criteria.

<sup>9</sup> Hindsight casts some doubt on this time as it was set extremely early in the year in a 'Training Match' at Battersea between two Belgrave teams. One might guess at there having been a single (inexperienced?) timekeeper.

<sup>10</sup> For manually timed 100 metres performances, wind readings are often not known. Therefore, performances known to be wind-assisted are included in the list which then continues with other performances that equalled the previous best time.

<sup>11</sup> Following this performance Ernest Obeng set a time of 10.42 in his heat at the All-Africa Games in Algiers in July 1978. He went on to place 5th in the final in 10.58. Unfortunately, as far as we can tell, no wind speed readings have been published, so the 10.42 has not been included here as a Club Record. It is shown instead in the category that follows.

<sup>12</sup> At the time, Dwain Chambers' 10.06 was a World Junior Record.

<sup>13</sup> Dwain Chambers' reaction time at the start was 0.063 seconds as against an allowable 0.1. However, the start was allowed.

<sup>14</sup> After testing positive for a banned performance-enhancing substance, Dwain Chambers' results between 01.01.2002, and 01.08.2003 were 1 officially annulled, thus ruling out improvements of 9.96, 9.94 and 9.87, all set during 2002.

<sup>15</sup> As far as we can tell, no wind speed readings were published for the All-Africa Games. It may well be that Ernest Obeng's 10.42 was completely valid.

<sup>16</sup> A faulty wind gauge meant that there were no wind speed readings for this or any of the other quarter-finals at the 2001 Edmonton IAAF World Championships. A World Junior Record by Mark Lewis-Francis was subsequently not ratified. Most statisticians agreed that the quarter-final performances may have been helped by a following wind, so we have followed suit and listed Dwain Chambers' 9.97 here instead of showing it as equalling his record.

<sup>18</sup> There may well have been faster times set during the 1928-29 period but published results in 'The Belgravian' mostly did not include times, even for the winner.

<sup>19</sup> Frank L. Craft may have run 220 yards in 21.8 in 1952 (wind-assisted) but this cannot be backed up by any evidence found so far. He had emigrated to Australia by the end of 1951. We simply show here that his 21.8 has been noted.

<sup>20</sup> George Dunckley's 21.9 was an extraordinary time for 1929 but in view of his last leg 4 x 440 performance of 48.6 for England in the match vs. Germany on 24.08.1929, it is possible that he did run this fast.

<sup>22</sup> For this race at Crystal Palace on 27.05.1974, Stephen White's 5th in 22.23 is shown as listed by the NUTS in their year-book of best performances. AW reported Stephen as placing 6th with the same time as the 5th placed runner - 22.2. Other sprinters in that race have manual times that correspond directly with the fully automatic times published by the NUTS. It would seem that Stephen's position and time were changed to as given above after the event when the photo-finish had been consulted.

<sup>60</sup> It has previously been recorded that George F. Piper had run in the 1908 London Olympic Marathon, but he does not appear in the results. He may have run in an event over the same course in 1908 but we do not have any trace of a result. He had been a member since at least 1905.

<sup>61</sup> On 30 September 1909 the Committee Minutes record that G.F. Piper's resignation had been accepted with regret and in 1911 he competed in the Polytechnic Marathon under the club name of Ashcombe A.C. However, in 1917 The "Illustrated Sporting and Dramatic News" refers to the, "Belgrave Harrier and Ashcombe Athletic Clubman, G.F. Piper, winning the 3 miles event," at a sports meeting at Paddington and there are references to him competing in walking events as "Belgrave Harriers". It is difficult to ascertain exactly what his club status was during this period.

<sup>62</sup> On 7 November 1919, among the new members was G.W. Piper. The initial "W" appears to be a typographical error. Was he formally clearing up his club status? He certainly (as G.F. Piper) competed for Belgrave Harriers in December 1919 in a Race Walk, in which Ashcombe A.C. also had a team entered. Nevertheless, he competed in the 1920 Polytechnic Marathon again as Ashcombe A.C., and thus qualified for the 1920 British Olympic Team. Perhaps we can assume that from September 1909 he was "Belgrave Harriers" for Race Walking and "Ashcombe A.C." for running; or maybe in those days, one could compete for which ever club one wanted, as long as one was a member. In any event, no Belgrave Harrier beat his 3:10:32 from 1909, until 1929. As a Belgrave Harrier, competing in the 1920 Olympic Games in Antwerp, he would have been the club's first ever international athlete.

<sup>63</sup> How unusual, that F.A. Walker staged two dead heats within one month in 1936. On the first occasion he ran in 15= with one Jack Brockbank, the second, 10=, with clubmate Alf Mitchell.

<sup>64</sup> This performance has yet to be found. The Association of Road Running Statisticians (ARRS) reports it as 2:37:02 at Port Talbot with a query on the time. Previous Belgravian statisticians have reported it as 2:37:20 without a venue. The race would appear to have been the Welsh AAA Marathon at Margan, Port Talbot, but the AthleticsStatsWales only show the Welsh medallists.

<sup>65</sup> ARRS reports this as a performance by John Macky of New Zealand. However, no other recorded instance of a marathoner named John Macky has been found. The Belgravian reports that Graham Macky ran 2:16:11 in Beijing.
