The Southern Committee was set up by the Amateur Athletic Association (AAA) in 1883 as a counterpart to the Northern Counties Athletic Association (NCAA) and the Midland Counties Amateur Athletic Association (MCAAA) and it served as an area AAA. In 1961, the Southern Counties Amateur Athletic Association was formed and was put on the same footing as the MCAAA and the NCAA. In 1991, the SCAAA amalgamated with the Southern Counties Women's Amateur Athletic Association (SCWAAA, founded in 1930) to form the South of England Athletic Association and from 1993 the new body held championships for both genders on the same date and at the same venue. The female races brought with them from the SCWAAA an under 13 girls' (known at the time as 'minors') race and in 1996 a boys' equivalent was added to the programme.

Senior Men

Before the First World War it was the Belgrave custom not to send a team to the 'Southern' unless the club had placed highly in the South of the Thames Cross Country Championship – 4th was stipulated in 1908. As with the 'National', it wasn't until Bert Footer came onto the scene in the '20s that the Club began to make the race a priority. In 1927 a team place of 10th was achieved – the best yet, and a position that was matched in the two subsequent editions of the race.

A startling improvement came in 1930 when on Brighton Racecourse, before around 3,000 spectators packed into the grandstand, the Bels took their first ever medals for third place, an event that was eclipsed by the even more surprising performance of Wycombe Phoenix Harriers & AC in second. A new order was presenting itself to challenge the Highgate Harriers, Surrey AC, South London Harriers hierarchy. For three decades the Bels were then only out of the medals on six occasions and in 1953 enjoyed the success of the Seniors, Juniors and Youths all placing in the top six.

Bert Footer's record in the event was extraordinary. First appearing in the race in 1923, he seven times led his team home, and when his individual win came in 1933 much was made of him in the newspapers:

"... Footer, a diminutive Belgrave Harrier has been competing in this championship for the past eleven years and it is refreshing to be able to put on record that his perseverance has at last paid off."

And that perseverance wasn't just for himself, for the following year, at Taplow Court in Buckinghamshire, the seat of Lord Desborough, Bert assisted his team to their first gold medals.

Glorious years followed, through the '40s to the mid-'50s and another individual win came from 'Tom' Carter in 1946. The '60s, too, saw a six-year consecutive run of team medals with Gerry North spearheading the squad and notching up the Club's third individual win (he had already previously won the Northern title).

In any documenting of the 'Southern' it would be remiss not to mention the outrageous performance of Shaftesbury's 20-year old David Bedford in 1970. A five-mile run in the morning was followed by a resounding 55-second victory in the Senior Men's 9 miles race; and before a quarter of an hour was up he was lining up for the Junior 6 miles race which he also proceeded to win by just over a minute.

For the Bels, the 1980s and '90s were lean years. It proved to be very problematic trying to gather at least six Belgravians who were inclined to tackle nine to ten miles of cross-country. Ironically this was at a time when the Club had some truly world class runners although, admittedly, they were mostly focused on the shorter middle-distance events. In 1996, for the first time since 1922, Belgrave did not take part.

The 21st century brought with it a new solidarity, however, and the last two decades have seen a gentle upswing in team positions, and two magnificent individual victories by Phil Wicks.

While other championship events have seen race-distances reduced over the years, the organisers of the Southern have doggedly stuck to the traditional 'old fashioned' cross country distance of ten miles, and subsequently 15

kilometres. An exception to this was the first race to be held after the Second World War when things were only just beginning to get back to normal; Belgrave Harriers hosted the race on Wimbledon Common and the distance was 7½

miles.

As with the 'National,' there was originally a limit on the number of runners allowed to be entered and then race. Only twelve were allowed to run until sometime after 1990 when the limit was removed and as a result scoring places and team scores became greatly inflated. Before 1928 we often only have the first six Belgrave runners recorded, and because of this, the statistics for 'most runs' and 'most consecutive completed runs' will be liable to change should we ever come across full results.

runners eventually covered some eleven or twelve miles before arriving at the finish where Belgrave appeared to have six men in the first twelve. Like most other clubs Belgrave did not enter the re-run some weeks later when only 32 individuals from four teams took part. The Junior field also went off course but as all the runners completed the same route, the result was allowed to stand.
